Bobsleigh CANADA Skeleton (**BCS**) is the national governing body for the sports of bobsleigh and skeleton in Canada. As one of Canada's most successful Winter Olympic sports, our program is based upon a platform of strong strategic and performance planning, teamwork and the relentless pursuit of excellence.

In alignment with our Mission, Vision and Values, Bobsleigh CANADA Skeleton is searching for a National Skeleton Program Technical Driving Coach (**NSP-TDC**), in order to support our Senior Skeleton Team (**SST**), on their path to podium performances in Beijing at the 2022 Olympic Winter Games.

Primary Purpose:

In consultation with program staff and while working under the authority of the High Performance Director (**HPD**) and direction of the SST-Head Coach (**SST-HC**), the successful candidate will be responsible for coaching and program delivery and execution. This refers to working with NSP athletes in preparation for training and competitions on the IBSF circuits and any other competition and/or training as directed by the HPD and/or SST-HC.

Primary Responsibilities:

- Providing expert advice, guidance and feedback to NSP athletes in the areas of on-ice technical driving and elite performance development;
- Planning, delivery and evaluation of all technical aspects at training, competition and camp venues internationally;
- Working with the SST-HC to prepare reports including: mid and end of season evaluations, weekly competition/training reports and other reviews as required;
- Working with the SST-HC to plan and implement an in-season travel logistics plan; and
- Attend all strategic, logistical or performance related meetings or events as required.

The ideal candidate will be a technically strong team player with coaching experience, who possesses excellent communication skills and is able to address the technical needs of the SST, within the overall goals of BCS.

The nature of the position demands flexible hours. This includes but is not limited to working extended hours, evenings and weekends, particularly in-season and during off-season camps, as well as significant international travel periods.
